

Literacy:

Children will take part in daily phonic sessions and will be assessed at the end of Summer 1. Children will delve into stories; 'Cops and robbers' and 'The Zoo vet'. As well as 'The Extraordinary Gardner' in line with Ready Steady Write English scheme. Children will have lots of opportunities for descriptive writing, and instructional writing.

Communication and Language:

Through our themes of People who help us and dinosaurs, children will lead in asking about their learning and ask questions about different job roles to build conversations. They will learn new vocabulary and repetitive phrases and have plenty of opportunities to delve into role play. Children will also learn about talking in different tense through news reporting. Children will also have the opportunity to ask questions the police and fire service.

Personal, social, and emotional development:

Children have daily opportunity to reinforce the importance of hygiene, independence and show perseverance when faced with a challenge. Understanding the world:

Physical Development:

During PE lessons children will be focusing on the lesson units- Cooperative and solving problems and Speed, agility and travel. Children will focus on communication, partner work, repeating patterns, and relays. Children will access the finger gym within continuous provision. Also, participating in activities to strengthen fine and gross motor skills and daily dough discos.

Expressive arts and design:

Children will have weekly sing up lessons. They will participate in a range of role play opportunities within a vets and a 'Dino world'. Children will learn about Vincent Van Gough through observational drawings and creating their own versions of Sunflowers.
