land-bridge	A strip of land that once connected two bigger areas of land so people or animals could walk across.
Ancestors	People from your family who lived a very long time ago.
Nomadic	Moving from place to place instead of living in one home.
Tools	Objects people use to help them do jobs, like cutting, digging, or building.
hunter-gatherers	People who got their food by hunting animals and collecting plants, berries, and nuts.
Stone Age	A time long ago when people made their tools and weapons from stone.
Mammoths	Huge, furry, elephant-like animals that lived in the Ice Age.
pre-history	The time before people wrote things down.
pre-historic	Something that happened or existed before writing was invented.
Skara Brae	A very old Stone Age village in Scotland that people can still visit today.
Mounds	Big heaps of earth or stones made by people or by nature.
Stonehenge	A circle of giant stones in England built thousands of years ago.
Midsummer's Day	The longest day of the year, when we get the most daylight.
