Vocabulary

Florence Nightingale / Lady of the Lamp – a nurse who saved the lives of many soldiers in the Crimean War.

Mary Seacole / Mother Seacole – a nurse who also cared for wounded soldiers in the Crimean War.

Edith Cavell – a nurse who saved hundreds of soldiers lives during WW1.

Crimean War – a war fought between 1853 and 1856 in Russia.

World War 1 – a war fought in Europe from 1914 – 1918.

Conditions – how good or bad a place / thing is.

Hospital – where someone goes for medical attention and treatment.

Wards – the different areas of a hospital.

Hygiene – how clean somewhere, someone or something is.

Reformed – change for the better.

Victorian Era – The reign of Queen Victoria during 1837 and 1901.
