Vocabulary

Palm Sunday - the Sunday before Easter, on which Christ's entry into Jerusalem is celebrated in many Christian churches

Temple - house of the Lord

Last Supper - The Last Supper is the final meal that, in the Gospel accounts, Jesus shared with his apostles in Jerusalem before his

Crucifixion - Jesus was killed on a cross by people who didn't like what he was teaching

Gethsemane - the garden outside Jerusalem mentioned in Mark 14 as the scene of the agony and arrest of Jesus. : a place or occasion of great mental or spiritual suffering

Good Friday - Christians around the world mourn and reflect on the day that Jesus Christ was crucified

Crucified - when Jesus was killed on the cross

Easter Sunday - the celebration of Jesus conquering death when he was resurrected from the dead

Resurrection - when God brought Jesus back to life
