Knowledge:

- There are different types of families.
- There are single parent families, same sex parents, stepparents, blended families, foster and adoptive parents.

- Identify that we need rules to live by, at home, at school and in the community.

Vocabulary:

Rights - something a person has that people think should not be taken away from them.

Responsibilities - being dependable and making good choices.

Respect - accepting people for who they are, even when they're different from you or you don't agree with them.

Unique - being the only one of it's kind.

Fostering - a child raised by someone who is not their birth parent.

Adoption - a child who has legally gone into someone's care who is not their biological parent.

Community - a large group of people in an area.

Similarities - things that are the same about two or more people or things.

Differences - things that are different about two or more people or things.

Lesson Sequence:

Lesson 1: I can give examples of respectful language, discuss good listening skills and give examples of how to challenge another's ideas.

Lesson 2: I can recognise the different types of families and understand key terms linked to them.

Lesson 3: I can describe community and what communities I belong to and why.

Lesson 4: I can understand different origins and explain the similarities and differences between diverse people.

Lesson 5: I can explain how people are similar and different and that repeated name calling is bullying.
