Knowledge:

Vocabulary:

God - the creator of the world and everything in it. People believe God is loving, powerful, and always present.

Father - In Christianity, the Father is one part of God. He is seen as a loving parent who watches over and cares for everyone.

Son - The Son refers to Jesus, who Christians believe is God's Son. He came to Earth to teach people, help them, and show God's love.

Holy Spirit - the part of God that guides and helps people. Christians believe the Holy Spirit is with them to give comfort, strength, and wisdom.

Trinity - God is three persons in one: the Father, the Son (Jesus), and the Holy Spirit. They are all God, but they are not the same.

Celtic - refers to the ancient people who lived in parts of Europe, especially Ireland, Scotland, and Wales. They had their own language, art, and beliefs.

Brahman - In Hinduism, Brahman is the one true God who is in everything and everywhere. Brahman can be seen in many different forms, like gods and goddesses.
