Vocabulary

Smash Shot

A smash is a powerful, fast shot hit downwards into your opponent's court. It's usually used to finish a rally and score a point.

Offensive

When you are offensive, you are trying to attack and win the point by playing strong, fast, or tricky shots.

Attacking

Attacking means taking control of the rally by hitting shots that put your opponent under pressure, such as smashes or fast drives.

Defending

Defending means trying to stop your opponent from scoring by returning their strong shots, especially smashes, and keeping the rally going.

Rally

A rally is the back-and-forth play between players after the shuttle has been served, until the point ends.

Drop Shot

A drop shot is a soft shot that makes the shuttle fall gently just over the net, making it hard for the opponent to reach.

Net Play

Net play means playing shots very close to the net, such as gentle taps or drops, to make your opponent move forward quickly.
