**Lesson Sequence**

**Lesson 3:** I can revise numbers 1-10 and to introduce numbers 11-20 in French.

**Lesson 4:** I can revise numbers 1-20 in French and to learn how to ask and answer the question 'Quel âge as-tu?' (How old are you?).

**Lesson 5:** to learn how to ask and answer the question 'Où habites-tu?' (Where do you live?).

Phonics - IN sound in cinq • I sound in huit, dix, Patrick, habite, Paris & suis • Silent letters. 'S' is not pronounced in appelles, ans, Paris, Londres or habites. • Elision. As seen in je m'appelle. Dropping of the last letter of a word (in this case the 'e' in me) and replacing it with an apostrophe, and attaching it to the word that follows, which begins with a vowel or mute h.
