Year 2 - Autumn 1 - Painting - Robert Delaunay

Knowledge:

Know that:-

- Robert Delaunay was born in Paris in 1885.
- He developed a new style of painting called Orphism, which was abstract
- He used bright colours, and simple shapes to express joy, movement and music.
- Primary colours are red, yellow, blue
- Secondary colours are orange, green, purple

Mixing:

red & yellow = orange
yellow & blue = green
red & blue = purple

Tints - adding white to a colour to make it lighter.

Shades – adding black to a colour to make it darker

To be able to name at least 1 of Delaunay's pieces.

Skills

Can use a brush with developing control to create a wide range of marks.

Can use brushes of different thickness.

Can mix a range of colours.

Can make a variety of tones by adding white.

Can make a variety of shades by adding black.

Vocabulary:

- **Orphism** – a type of abstract art
- **Brushstroke** – painting with a brush
- **Primary** – colours that can't be created by mixing other colours
- **Secondary** – the colours between primary colours on the colour wheel
- **Tones** – lightness or darkness of a colour
- **Bold** – in art this can mean 'lively'
- **Bright** – colours with a high level of brightness
- **Dark**
- **Darker**
- **Light**
- **Lighter**

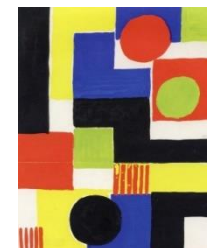
